School Kitchen Garden Resources

School kitchen gardens provide many benefits for students and school communities. Students are exposed to a range of vegetables, fruits and plants and learn how to grow and care for them. This can encourage healthier eating habits as students may be more willing to try vegetables they have grown and are familiar with. School gardens also foster social connection and team work, and support emotional and mental health. They are beneficial to physical health and can positively influence academic achievement in students.

School gardens can be linked to:-

- Student learning e.g science, recycling waste, measuring (maths), writing, cooking, reading, art and other Key Learning Areas
- Crunch&Sip veg, fruit and water break
- Canteen
- Learning about bush tucker and First Nations cultures
- Fundraising for the school
